Claims Submission Alert

Please note that there are two separate plans offered by AmeriHealth Caritas North Carolina, Inc.

For AmeriHealth Caritas North Carolina **Medicaid Managed Care** claims, please use EDI payer ID number 81671.

For AmeriHealth Caritas Next Federally Qualified Health Plan (FQHP) claims please use EDI payer ID number 83148.

Improper claim submissions could result in payment delays. Please see <u>the complete notice</u> for more information.

Trauma-informed Care Education Series

As part of ACNC's commitment to our members and providers, we are launching a variety of educational activities around Trauma-Informed Care, beginning this month with a nine-session lunchtime videoconference series in collaboration with Project ECHO. The Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes, or ECHO model™, functions like "virtual chart rounds," where practitioners present de-identified patient cases for peer mentoring and guided practice. Participants can earn CEUs at no cost and may attend one or all of the sessions. Find out more and register here.

- Realize the widespread impact of trauma and understand paths for recovery;
- Recognize the signs and symptoms of trauma in patients, families, and staff;
- Integrate knowledge about trauma into policies, procedures, and practices; and
- Actively avoid re-traumatization.
