State COVID-19 Flexibilities Extended


COVID-19 Vaccination Eligibility and Overdue Report

AmeriHealth Caritas North Carolina (ACNC) is continuing to prioritize member vaccinations against COVID-19, offering <u>financial incentives</u> to our unvaccinated members and conducting direct member outreach via phone and text. We know that vaccines continue to be the most effective tool in preventing serious illness and hospitalization from COVID-19.

Trusted provider partners play a vital role in this effort. Two important reminders:

- NC Medicaid covers vaccine counseling encounters if face-to-face, telehealth, or telephonic

State Law Extends Maternity Benefits

Effective April 1, 2022, NC Medicaid coverage for pregnant beneficiaries will extend to the last day of the month in which the 12-month postpartum period ends. The change is made pursuant to NC Senate Bill 105 Session Law 2021-180 Section 9D.13 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Please see MCDHHS guidance here.

CLAIMS AND BILLING

Prospective Claims Payment Review Process

AmeriHealth Caritas North Carolina leadership has completed an evaluation of our prospective claims payment review process and has made the following changes, effective April 15, 2021.

- The claims threshold for prospective payment claims review has been increased to \$100,000 from the previous threshold of \$40,000.
- Per Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services guidelines, Diagnosis Related Group (DRG) facility claims with a paid value of more than \$100,000 and a specific cost outlier of \$1,000 and greater will be referred to our medical claim review vendor, Equian, for evaluation.
- NOTE* If your inpatient claim will pay greater than \$100,000 and has cost outliers it is recommended that you include your itemized bill with your claim submission to avoid a denial for an itemized bill.

Prior Authorizations Reminder

Beginning May 1, ACNC will no longer accept claims submitted without required prior authorizations. ACNC had implemented selected prior authorization flexibilities to allow providers time to adjust to Medicaid managed care and to learn ACNC authorization processes. We believe sufficient time has passed to end these flexibilities.

Please use our Prior Authorization Lookup Tool to find out if a service requires prior authorization.

PHARMACY NEWS

Updated Preferred Drug List Release: April 1, 2022

Mark your calendars: The preferred drug list is updated twice yearly, in April and October. Please note the following updates to the NC Medicaid Preferred Drug List (PDL):

- Brand-name Invega tablets will now be preferred, generic paliperidone ER tablets will not be nonpreferred.
 - To prevent any delays in treatment: If you have a patient currently prescribed generic
 paliperidone ER tablets and do not want them to switch to the preferred brand, please make
 sure to submit a Pharmacy Prior Authorization Request as soon as possible.
- The Dexcom G5 Transmitter/Receiver and the Dexcom G4/G5 Platinum Sensor 4 Pack are being discontinued by the manufacturer and will no longer be on the PDL or covered as a pharmacy benefit.
 - Supplies may still be available through DME providers while they last.
 - o Consider switching your patient to Dexcom G6 review Clinical Coverage Criteria and submit the Continuous Glucose Monitor Pharmacy Prior Authorization Form found here.

Updates To ACNC Pharmacy Prior Authorization Criteria And Forms

Please note the following updates:

- Hepatitis C Treatment Criteria and Forms Added expanded indication for Zepatier to include pediatric patients ≥ 12 years old or weighing ≥ 30 kg for the treatment of chronic HCV genotype 1 or 4 infection.
- Hetlioz Criteria and Form Removed requirement the patient must have a diagnosis of blindness.
- Nexletol and Nexlizet New clinical coverage criteria established.
- PCSK9 Criteria and Form Updated age limits for Repatha.

At ACNC, we are committed to helping you deliver the best care to your patients. To improve health outcomes, we created the Provider Quality Enhancement Value-Based Compensation Program.

The program features a unique reimbursement model intended to reward providers for delivering high-quality and cost-effective care. Providers are rewarded for each member who is attributed to the practice and receives the recommended wellness or preventive care outlined in each of the quality metrics. NaviNet Resources

To keep the provider community informed about Prepaid Health Plan (PHP)-identified system issues and to provide transparency around issue mitigation, as well as provider impact, the NC DHHS Division of Health Benefits is requiring PHPs to make a Known System Issues Tracker available to providers. We have posted the tracker on our provider portal, <u>NaviNet</u>. It is updated weekly.

Expanded Monthly Training Opportunities for Providers, Staff

Building on the success and convenience of our Zoom-based training opportunities, ACNC will expand our training schedule beginning in April 2022. Our new trainings will help you and your teams enroll in our Electronic Funds Transfer payment system, learn about our Quality Enhancement Programs, and show you how to access helpful tools and resources.
