PHARMACY PRIOR AUTHORIZATIONS

Options for Pharmacy Prior Authorizations

Pharmacy providers may submit a request for pharmacy prior authorizations in any of the following ways:

- 1. Prior authorization request forms can be accessed here, then scroll to **How to submit a request for pharmacy prior authorizations**
 - Download and complete the appropriate prior authorization form from the list.
 - Make sure ALL pertinent questions are answered, attach any documentation requested, and make sure the form is signed by the ordering prescriber.
 - Fax your completed Prior Authorization Request Form to 1-877-234-4274 or call 1-866-885-1406,
 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Saturday.

- If you have questions after business hours (Sunday and holidays), please call Member Services at 1-855-375-8811 (TTY 1-866-206-6421)
- 2. Call the ACNC Pharmacy Provider Services at 1-866-885-1406 to submit a prior authorization request for a medication to be picked up at a pharmacy over the phone.
- 3. Submit an electronic prior authorization (e-PA) through your electronic health record (E.H.R) software

If the pharmacy prior authorization for a medication is denied, you can appeal the decision. How to submit an appeal:

- 1. Address **EACH** reason for the denial listed in the denial letter and provide pertinent documentation to support the appeal, e.g., letter of medical necessity including reason for continuation of medication, office visit notes, laboratory tests or values, or the completed drug specific form (if applicable).
 - Ensure that the consent section on the appeal request form is signed by the member or their legal guardian. Please include their current telephone number.
 - Include your current contact information including phone number and fax number for expedient communication.
 - Fax appeal form to 1-833-883-2262, along with all pertinent documentation for the appeal, e.g., letter of medical necessity, office visit notes, laboratory tests or values, or the completed drug-specific form (if applicable).
- 2. If a communication is received from the Appeals Department requesting additional information, please address **EACH** specific item noted therein and resubmit for timely processing.

PRIOR AUTHORIZATIONS

Prior Authorizations Reminder

Beginning May 1, ACNC will no longer accept claims submitted without required prior authorizations. ACNC had implemented selected prior authorization flexibilities to allow providers time to adjust to Medicaid managed care and to learn ACNC authorization processes. We believe sufficient time has passed to end these flexibilities.

Please use our Prior Authorization Lookup Tool to find out if a service requires prior authorization.


COVID-19 Vaccination Eligibility and Overdue Report

AmeriHealth Caritas North Carolina (ACNC) is continuing to prioritize member vaccinations against COVID-19, offering \$75 reward to our unvaccinated members who get a COVID vaccine before June 30 and conducting direct member outreach via phone and text. We know that vaccines continue to be the most effective tool in preventing serious illness and hospitalization from COVID-19.

Trusted provider partners play a vital role in this effort. Two important reminders:

- NC Medicaid covers vaccine counseling encounters if face-to-face, telehealth, or telephonic

- NC Medicaid increased the COVID Vaccine Administration fee to \$65 earlier this year

Reminder: Billing Guidance for COVID Over-the-Counter Tests for Home Use

NC DHHS announced that effective January 10, 2022, NC Medicaid-enrolled pharmacy providers may bill point-of-sale (POS) for FDA-approved over-the counter (OTC) COVID-19 tests dispensed for use by NC Medicaid beneficiaries in a home setting. Self-Paced Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Training Modules with CEUs

North Carolina Area Health Education Center (NC AHEC) is offering self-paced modules specifically for Primary Care Physician Providers and Non-clinical Staff. Modules 2 and 3 are offered for a registration fee of \$10 and CEU credits are available.

According to NC AHEC, healthcare providers are required to be competent not only in medicine but also in communication and caring for people with different disease burdens, socio-cultural realities, expectations, values, and beliefs. Be it the result of a language barrier, differences in philosophy, differences in cultural norms (& expectations), or even cultural bias, lack of diversity can lead to communication breakdown with patients.
